

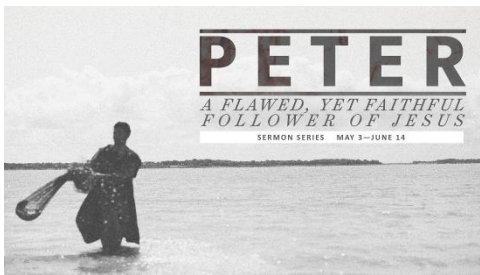
# What's Happening



Welcome to our morning worship 24<sup>th</sup> May 2026 as we continue our teaching series entitled Flawed Yet Faithful: The Life of Peter

Peter's story is one of passion, failure, and restoration. Though impulsive and imperfect, he was deeply loved by Jesus and shaped into a faithful leader of the early church. This series explores Peter's journey from bold devotion to painful denial—and finally to courageous faith.

Through Peter's life, we are reminded that God does not require perfection, but faith that grows through grace. His story offers hope to all who struggle, fail, and rise again, showing that flawed people can still be used powerfully by a faithful God.

**Please give thanks** for the members willing to serve on our Congregational Committee as they begin their service

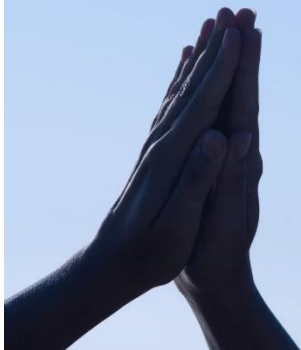
**Please pray** for all our volunteers, leaders and helpers without whom we would not be able to meet and serve one another and our community each week.
